DAY 1: GETTING CLOSER

They said to each other, "Didn't our hearts burn within us as He talked with us on the road and explained the Scriptures to us?" LUKE 24:32

It was a very cold winter in the art studio last year. In the midst of those cold harsh months, my gas heater stopped working. As I painted in a full winter coat, technicians came to uncover the problem of no heat. It was a mystery at first. The propane line was clear, electronics were all in order, and the igniter was firing, yet still ... no flame. The colder the temperature dropped in my studio, the more difficult it was for the heater to start. After much trial and error, the cause of the problem was narrowed down to two small prongs on the heater spark plug. These tiny pieces of metal are positioned very close to each other so that a spark can be created between them, igniting a flame in the presence of gas. But years of prolonged use had worn down the prongs and created a subtle distance between them. As a result, the spark plug was no longer able to consistently produce a flame.

The technician did one small thing to address the problem, which had a dramatic impact on the function of the heater. He simply bent the two prongs closer together. At once, the spark ignited, producing a flame and heating the room. The simple truth was this; they just needed to get closer to one another.

It reminds me of the time when Jesus appeared to two of His disciples as they walked to Emmaus. He drew close to them, teaching them the Scriptures. As a result, their hearts burned within them. Think of it this way. You and Jesus are a bit like those two metal prongs bent toward each other, and the Holy Spirit is the flame that ignites within your heart, causing you to burn with passion for Him. You just need to get closer! This is the pivotal role of prayer in our spiritual journey.

"My secret is a very simple one: I pray," wrote Mother Teresa of Calcutta, a modern master of the skill.

"Prayer is simply talking to God.

He speaks to us: we listen.

We speak to Him: He listens.

A two-way process:

Speaking and listening."
